Thank you to everyone who brought their children to sing on Easter. I know some of you were out of town. The kids did a great job on both songs. I hope you had an enjoyable Easterbreak, spent time with family or friends, and got outside in the beautiful weather we had! I need to leave school 15 minutes early on Tuesday to help transport kids and work at the track meet after school. The plan is for the Kindergarteners to join the first and second graders at the end of the day. Here are some things we will work on this week:

### **Bible Lesson**

We have our last of the Easter stories this week. We will hear how Jesus proved to his disciples that he had risen from the dead. Jesus uses God's Word to prove that he is our risen Savior. Thomas believed that Jesus was alive only after he saw Jesus. God gives us faith to believe in Jesus even though we can't see him. Our second lesson is about another appearance of Jesus to the disciples after he had risen. He helps them catch lots of fish after a night of catching nothing. Jesus told his disciples to teach his Word to all people. He tells us to do the same. Our memory work for this week:

For Thursday: **Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.** (John 20:29)

For Friday: **Go and make disciples of all nations.** (Matthew 28:19)

For Friday: Hymn 379 *Amazing Grace*

### **Math**

This week we will be recording the answer to a question on a chart; determining questions for a two-choice survey; identifying a cone; sorting three-dimensional objects; identifying time of day as day or night; identifying time of day as morning, afternoon, or evening; sequencing events that happen during the day; comparing temperatures of different times of the day; identifying the likelihood of events; identifying events as more, equally, or less likely; counting by 2's; and identifying even or odd numbers to 10.

We will finish up the letters "K" and "Q" on Tuesday and begin the letter "J" on Wednesday.

### **Social Studies**

We will be learning about Earth Day.

### **Science**

We will finish up our unit on colors and rainbows.

### **Art**

We will be making flowers with Bingo daubers and popcorn!

We will be reading Earth Day books all of this week.
